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EDITORIAL

The President of India, Ram Nath Kovind was absolutely right when he said at the convocation of Guru Ghasidas University, Chhattisgarh on March 2, 2020 that the main objective of education is not only to get a degree but also to become a good person. He said that it is the duty of every university (and schools too) to inculcate values like honesty, discipline, tolerance and respect for law among students. He, in fact, echoed the sentiments incorporated in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, 1948 which declared education as a human right and 'shall be directed to the full development of the human personality and to the strengthening of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms'. Fortunately, Indian constitution and judiciary has not only guaranteed but also jealously guarded the fundamental human rights and freedoms to its citizens. To promote India as a modern constitutional state, the basic framework of the constitution and its constitutional values are necessarily inculcated among our young population. One of the most sacred features of India is its secularism, which, of late, is under heavy stress for a definitional and operational change. In the famous S.R. Bommai vs. Union of India (1994) case, Supreme Court of India has stated that secularism has been an essential part of the basic structure of the Constitution. In recent times, our educational system is progressively failing in its duty to promote secularism as enshrined in the constitution. Nehru, the first Prime Minister, had cautioned us when he said that, "only through right education can a better order of society be built up".

We are now witnessing two major onslaughts on our education system. Firstly, one should not forget that Article 28 of the constitution prohibits providing religious instruction or forcing a child to attend religious education in any educational institution wholly maintained out of state funds or receiving state aid. Further, Article 27 says that tax payer's money cannot be used to promote religion. But there have been obvious attempts to change curriculum and contents of text books to suit a particular religious - political ideology. Veer Savarkar and his Hindutva ideology is finding respectful place in the syllabus by projecting him as a freedom fighter. There are certain state governments, who have been making regular attempts to introduce Saraswati rhymes and teaching of Bhagvad Geeta in government schools. Eminent historians are on record with facts and evidences that history is being distorted to creep in communal ideological biases. The draft National Education Policy (NPE) has left no doubt about attempts to saffronise education. The NPE's claim of "drawing from India's heritage" is tilted toward ancient India but fully ignore the contribution of intellectuals and scholars of medieval and modern India.

The other threat is from gauging the intellectual and academic freedom and thereby suffocating the innovation and debate in educational institutions. Nehru had told us that, "a university stands for humanism, for tolerance, for reason, for the adventure of ideas and for the search for truth". And when he mentions university, it refers to all kinds of educational institutions. The news from UP that the principal of a school was suspended for allowing children to recite a patriotic poem of a Urdu poet or parent and principal in Karnataka have been charged of sedition and jailed for staging a play against a government decision or students of JNU and JMI were beaten for opposing the policies of the ruling party in power, do not repose our faith in the lofty claims of academic ...

autonomy. Our education requires freedom from governmental control to excel and find place in international rankings. Today, none of our university finds a place among top hundred universities of the world. Annual Status of Education Reports (ASER) based on national surveys presented every year by reputed NGO, PRATHAM do not present a very happy picture of quality of education in government schools in India. If President of India's wish to provide quality education with appropriate moral values is to be fulfilled, the government has no option but to loosen its administrative and ideological grip and give much required freedom to educational institutions.

Here, one wonders about minority's institutions, those have full right to set up and manage their own educational institutions under Articles 29 and 30 of the constitution. With autonomy bestowed by the constitution why Muslim minority, in particular, is not making use of this opportunity to present the best educational models to the nation? Question is, at times, raised: Are minority institutions discharging their responsibilities faithfully to ensure required levels of excellence in research and teaching or even in management? Minority education institutions need to survive on their performance and not on the clutches of legal guarantees. Only excellence in education can ensure equity, equality and justice. If minority managed institutions are lacking in providing best of the best education, they are causing disservice to their beneficiaries. If students coming out of minority education institutions lack in required knowledge, professional skills and social behaviour, they will not be an asset but burden on the society. Recruitment and up gradation of competencies of the faculty on a regular basis is vital to achieve the desired outcome of our education.

Report on Caravan for Education & Harmony, 2019

All India Educational Movement and UP Rabita Committee have been carrying out Educational Caravan from time to time for promotion of quality education among weaker sections and minorities. This year the Caravan of AIEM started from Allahabad and reached Bilaspur in Chhattisgarh and five districts of MP. Highlights of the Caravan are given in this report.

A group of AIEM members consisting of Mr. Mozaffar Ali, Gen Secretary, AIEM, Dr. M. Ilyas Saifi, Secretary, AIEM and Mr. Moin Akhtar Ansari, reached Allahabad on 25 Nov, 2019 morning. Mr. Safi Anwary had already reached from Beed, Maharashtra. The caravan reached Taleem Ghar, situated at Kareli for a brief introduction. An educational symposium was organised by Br. Ehsanullah Ansari sb through Kaneez Fatima Educational Social Welfare Charitable Society, running computer learning classes for girls and several other courses are being taught.

In between a team of the caravan members visited, Ghaus Memorial Girls Inter College accompanied by Prof. Saleha Rasheed HOD, Arabic & Persian Deptt, Allahabad University & Mr. Tariq Azmi for an interaction with teachers and students. It was a very useful meeting and the local educational situation was assessed. Mr. Kazim Abdi, advocate high court, previously, a veteran journalist presided over the meeting. Mr. Qamarul Hasan Siddiqui, Retired Attorney General of UP was the Chief Guest.

Mr. Farmood Allahabadi, a poet and social activist compared and moderated the meeting. Members of the caravan spoke briefly and focused on the area of quality education, universal enrolment, containing the dropout rate, motivating the students to work hard, teachers to ensure their teaching results in positive learning and keep themselves up to date to become ideal role-models for the students and parents to actively participate in improving the educational achievement of their children. It was also discussed that the present environment of hate is dangerous for the country and all communities should come together to fight communalization and polarization.

Prof. Saleha Rashid, HOD, Allahabad University spoke about the poor educational condition of the area and said a number of schools and inter-colleges have been established but the dream of quality education for the common people is still far away. Girls' education is even worse. The poor parental support and early marriage are generally responsible for high dropout rate.

In the end Mr. Qamrul Hasan Siddiqui, the Chief Guest and Maulana Kazim Abdi sb, presiding over the meeting, spoke at length about the local conditions and lauded the efforts of AIEM and Caravan members to have taken up this noble mission and thanked for including Allahabad in the Caravan itinerary.

It was also suggested and everyone agreed that a committee be formed to make a basic survey and make preparations for effective social intervention for improvement. A motivational workshop for students, teachers and parents is required as starting point of follow up program. The committee headed by Br. Ehsanullah Ansari will discuss the issues with others and make suitable programs.


Dr. Zafarul Islam Khan congratulated the caravan members and stated that such caravans helped in improving the conditions of our scholars and the quality of education.



Prof. Aehatesham Hasnain, VC of Jamia Hamdard paid rich tribute to Late Saiyid Hamid as VC of AMU, his pivotal role as member of Sachchar Committee in highlighting social educational and economic problems of Muslims, as chancellor of Hamdard University and specially setting up Hamdard Study Circle for Civil Services. He stated that we are in the midst of Digital World and spoke in detail about its importance and utility moving from data to information to knowledge and finally to wisdom. Apps have been created to achieve quick and efficient results. Uber is largest taxi service in the world without owning a single vehicle.

Similarly, Airbnb is largest hotel chain in the world without owning a single hotel or resort. Auto cars are also expected in near future. 3D Printing technology is now creating new products like shoes, etc. Solar power is presently limited to 15% and is likely to increase to 40% in near future. Possibility of human cloning is threatening social beliefs.

Sachchar Committee has brought to light, he stated, that Muslims happened to be the most backward socially and educationally. GER is expected to increase from 12% to 30% but share of Muslims is limited to 5% only. Most of the 20 most backward districts in the country have Muslim concentration. He was of the view that feeling of discrimination against Muslims is not correct. Prof. Hasnain informed that condition of Jamia Hamdard has improved a lot during his tenure as VC and number of students has gone up from 5000 to 9000. National Ranking of Jamia University has improved and it enjoys 18th position in the top Universities and has now been recommended as an institution of excellence by the Government.

Mr. Amanullah Khan, Managing Trustee of Saiyid Hamid Foundation informed the audience of his long association with Late Saiyid Hamid and the services rendered by him including creation of UP Rabita Committee, All India Educational Movement and Muslim Educational Trust. He took keen interest in taking out Educational caravans which we have now been following every year or two years. Muslim Educational Trust has awarded more than 16000 scholarships to eligible students pursuing higher education.
